<u>Craft</u>

Hey lovely Starlight Families, hoping you are all still keeping safe and well and that you have had a good week too!

Our craft today is linked to the part of the story when Jesus met with the other disciples, for the third time, after He had risen and how there was a big catch of fish and then they had some breakfast together and is taken from John 21:1-15. The disciples went back to their old lives for a little while which meant that Peter and some of the others took out their boat to go fishing. While out there, someone from the shore shouted out to them, "Friends, haven't you any fish?", they answered "No", to which the man replied "Throw your net on the right side of the boat and you will find some." They did as the man said and caught 153 fish in their net. The disciples realised that it was Jesus at the shore, they went to him and they had breakfast together.

For this week's craft we will make a boat like the one the disciples were on when Jesus visited them. You will need:

- 1 x egg box
- 2 x straws (cut to different lengths)
- A4 or square paper
- Glue
- Colouring pens
- Paint

Step 1: Cut the egg box so the lid and base are separate.



Step 2: Paint or colour the egg box.



Step 3: Place the base of the egg box inside the lid to make the shape of your boat.



Step 4: Cut the straws to two different lengths.



Step 5: Glue the straws sticking up from the base of the boat to make poles for sails.



Step 6: Make the A4 paper into a square and cut into 2 triangles for the sails.



Step 7: Take one sail and fold in half.



Step 8: Decorate one side of your sail with the numbers 153 and some fish.



Step 9: Decorate the other side



Step 10: Take your second sail, fold in half and decorate light shining down.



Step 11: Decorate the other side.



Step 12: Glue your sails around the straws.



There you have it, your very own sailboat. Enjoy.
